



# The Shape of Water (2hrs, 3min) (Nominated for 7 Golden Globes)

In a 1960s research laboratory, a mute janitor (Sally Hawkins) forms a relationship with an aquatic creature.

Also starring Octavia Spencer, Michael Shannon & Richard Jenkins. | From master storyteller Guillermo del Toro comes an otherworldly fable set against the backdrop of Cold War era America circa 1962. In the hidden high-

security government laboratory where she works, lonely Elisa is trapped in a life of isolation. Elisa's life is changed forever when she and co-worker discover a secret classified experiment. Rating: R



Darkest Hour (1hr, 29min) During the early days of World War II, the fate of Western Europe hangs on the newly-appointed British Prime Minister Winston Churchill, who must decide whether to negotiate with Hitler, or fight on against incredible odds. Starring Gary Oldman and Kristin Scott Thomas. Winston Churchill must face one of his most turbulent and defining trials: exploring a negotiated peace treaty with Nazi Germany, or standing firm to fight for the ideals, liberty and freedom of a nation. As the unstoppable Nazi forces roll across Western Europe and the threat of

invasion is imminent, and with an unprepared public, a skeptical King, and his own party plotting against him, Churchill must withstand his darkest hour, rally a nation, and attempt to change the course of world history. **Rating: PG-13** 



#### Call Me By Your Name (2hrs, 12min)

(Nominated for 3 Golden Globes) | In Northern Italy in 1983, seventeen year-old Elio begins a relationship with Oliver, his father's research assistant, with whom he bonds over his emerging sexuality, their Jewish heritage and the beguiling Italian landscape. Starring Armie Hammer, Timothée Chalamet & Michael Stuhlbarg. While Elio's, a precocious 17- year-old American-Italian, sophistication and intellectual gifts suggest he is already a fully-

fledged adult, there is much that yet remains innocent and unformed about him, particularly about matters of the heart. One day, Oliver a charming American scholar, arrives as the annual summer intern tasked with helping Elio's father. Amid the sundrenched splendor of the setting, Elio and Oliver discover the heady beauty of awakening desire over the course of a summer that will alter their lives forever. **Rating: R** 



### I, Tonya (1hr, 59min)

Competitive ice skater Tonya Harding rises amongst the ranks at the U.S. Figure Skating Championships, but her future in the activity is thrown into doubt when her exhusband intervenes. Starring Margot Robbie & Sebastian Stan. Featuring an iconic turn by Margot Robbie as the fiery Harding, a mustachioed Sebastian Stan as her impetuous ex-husband Jeff Gillooly, a tour-de-force performance from


Allison Janney as her acid-tongued mother, LaVona Golden, and an original screenplay by Steven Rogers, Craig Gillespie's I, TONYA is an absurd, irreverent, and piercing portrayal of Harding's life and career in all of its unchecked—and checkered—glory. Rating: R



#### Phantom Thread (2hrs, 10min)

Set in 1950's London, Reynolds Woodcock is a renowned dressmaker whose fastidious life is disrupted by a young, strong-willed woman, Alma, who becomes his muse and lover. Starring 3 time Oscar winner Daniel Day-Lewis who has announced this is his final film due to retirement. | The House of Woodcock with its distinct style, dressed royalty, movie stars, heiresses, socialites, debutants and dames. Women would come

and go through Woodcock's life, providing the confirmed bachelor with inspiration and companionship, until he comes across a young, strong-willed woman, Alma (Vicky Krieps), who soon becomes a fixture in his life as his muse and lover. Once controlled and planned, he finds his carefully tailored life disrupted by love. Rating: R



#### Jane (1hr, 30min)

(Winner of Critics Choice Awards-Best Documentary 2017)

The life and work of the renowned primatology scientist,
Jane Goodall, especially on her research about chimpanzees.
Drawing from over 100 hours of never-before-seen footage that has been tucked away in the National Geographic archives for over 50 years, award-winning director Brett Morgen tells the story of JANE, a woman whose chimpanzee

research challenged the male-dominated scientific consensus of her time and revolutionized our understanding of the natural world. Set to a rich orchestral score from legendary composer Philip Glass, the film offers an unprecedented, intimate portrait of Jane Goodall—a trailblazer who defied the odds to become one of the world's most admired conservationists. **Rating: PG** 



## Film Stars Don't Die in Liverpool

(1hr, 45min)

What starts as a vibrant affair between a Hollywood leading lady (Annette Benning) and her young lover (Jamie Bell), quickly grows into a deeper relationship, with him being the person she turns to for comfort. | However, FILM STARS...centres on Peter Turner, a jobbing actor whose life takes an unexpected turn when he falls in love with Ms Grahame. As Turner, Jamie Bell,

who has developed into an accomplished supporting actor over the years since BILLY ELLIOT, is promoted to leading man. He's excellent. A revelation. Authoritative, sexy, strong, romantic, vulnerable—you name it, Mr Bell communicates it sincerely, without any sense of artifice. A first-rate performance. Rating: R



#### In The Fade (1hr, 46min)

Katja's life collapses after the death of her husband and son in a bomb attack. After a time of mourning and injustice, Katja seeks revenge. Starring Diane Kruger, Denis Moschitto & Numan Acar. | Katja's friends and family try to give her the support she needs, and Katja somehow manages to make it through the funeral. But the mind numbing search for the perpetrators and reasons behind the senseless

killing complicate Katja's painful mourning, opening wounds and doubts. Danilo, a lawyer and Nuri's best friend, represents Katja in the eventual trial against the two suspects: a young couple from the neo-Nazi scene. The trial pushes Katja to the edge, but there's simply no alternative for her: she wants justice. Rating: R



#### The Leisure Seeker (1hr. 52min)

Helen Mirren & Donald Sutherland star as a runaway couple who go on an unforgettable journey in their beloved old RV to recapture their passion for life and their love for each other on a road trip. In the faithful old RV they call The Leisure Seeker, they travel from Boston to The Ernest Hemingway Home in Key West. They recapture their passion for life and their love for each other on a road

trip that provides revelation and surprise right up to the very end. Rating:  ${f R}$
