






Ask Dr. Ruth (1 hr, 40 mins)

Holocaust survivor Dr. Ruth Westheimer revisits her incredible past and rise to become America's most famous sex therapist on the eve of her 90th birthday.

Ask Dr. Ruth chronicles the incredible life of Dr. Ruth Westheimer, a Holocaust survivor who became America's most famous sex therapist. With her diminutive frame, thick German accent, and uninhibited approach to sex

therapy and education, Dr. Ruth transformed the conversation around sexuality. As she approaches her 90th birthday and shows no signs of slowing down, Dr. Ruth revisits her painful past and unlikely path to a career at the forefront of the sexual revolution. **Rating: NR**



Wild Nights with Emily (1 hr, 24 mins)

Nineteenth century poet Emily Dickinson (Molly Shannon) battles literary gatekeepers confused by her work while drawing inspiration from her romance with her sister-in-law.

In the mid-19th century, Emily Dickinson is writing prolifically, baking gingerbread, and enjoying a passionate, lifelong romantic relationship with another woman, her friend and sister-in-law Susan...yes this is the iconic

American poet, popularly thought to have been a recluse. Beloved comic Molly Shannon leads in this humorous yet bold reappraisal of Dickinson, informed by her private letters. While seeking publication of some of the 1,775 poems, her work attracts the attention of an ambitious woman editor, who also sees Emily as a convenient cover for her own role in buttoned-up Amherst's most bizarre love triangle. **Rating: PG-13**



Tolkien (1 hr, 54 mins)

A young J.R.R. Tolkien explores love and friendship while finding literary inspiration on the eve of World War I. Starring Lily Collins and Nicholas Hoult.

Tolkien explores the formative years of the orphaned author as he finds friendship, love and artistic inspiration among a group of fellow outcasts at school. This takes him into the outbreak of World War I, which

threatens to tear the fellowship apart. All of these experiences would inspire Tolkien to write his famous Middle-Earth novels. **Rating: PG-13**



Red Joan (1 hr, 41 mins)

Judi Dench stars as an English retiree exposed as the KGB's longest-serving spy, decades after her post-war work at a top-secret nuclear research facility.

In a picturesque village in England, Joan Stanley lives in contented retirement. Then suddenly her tranquil existence is shattered as she's shockingly arrested by MI5. For Joan has been hiding an incredible past; she is one of

the most influential spies in living history. At Cambridge University in the 1930s, Joan, a demure physics student, falls in love with attractive Russian saboteur, Leo. Through him, she begins to see that the world is on a knife-edge and perhaps must be saved from itself in the race to military supremacy. Post-war and now working at a top secret nuclear research facility, Joan is confronted with the impossible: Would you betray your country and your loved ones, if it meant saving them? Inspired by an extraordinary true story. **Rating: R**



The White Crow (2 hrs, 7 mins)

Ralph Fiennes directs this dramatization of ballet dancer Rudolf Nureyev's defection from the Soviet Union to the West in 1961. | Ralph Fiennes' *The White Crow* was

inspired by the book "Rudolf Nureyev: The Life" by Julie Kavanagh. The drama charts the iconic dancer's famed defection from the Soviet Union to the West in 1961, despite KGB efforts to stop him. **Rating: R**



All is True (1 hr, 41 mins)

William Shakespeare returns home after the Globe Theatre burns, leaving him to confront his neglected family and broken relationships. Starring Kenneth Branagh, Judi Dench, and Ian McKellen.

The year is 1613, Shakespeare is acknowledged as the greatest writer of the age. But disaster strikes when his renowned Globe Theatre burns to the ground, and

devastated, Shakespeare returns to Stratford, where he must face a troubled past and a neglected family. Haunted by the death of his only son Hamnet, he struggles to mend the broken relationships with his wife and daughters. In so doing, he is ruthlessly forced to examine his own failings as husband and father. His very personal search for the truth uncovers secrets and lies within a family at war. **Rating: PG-13**



The Biggest Little Farm (1 hr, 31 mins)

Documentary filmmaker John Chester and his wife Molly share their journey to create a 200-acre sustainable farm outside of Los Angeles.

A testament to the immense complexity of nature, *The Biggest Little Farm* follows two dreamers and a dog on an odyssey to bring harmony to both their lives and the land. **Rating: PG**
