

With unflinching honesty, self-examination, regret, fear, exuberance and an unshakable belief in family and the

transformative nature of music, Crosby shares his often challenging journey. Rating: **R**

Intelligence whistleblower Katharine Gun, who prior to the 2003 Iraq invasion leaked a top-secret NSA memo exposing a joint US-UK illegal spying operation against members of the UN Security Council. The memo proposed blackmailing member states into voting for war. Rating: R

The Peanut Butter Falcon (1 hr. 33 mins)

Zak runs away from his care home to pursue a career in wrestling, making new friends on his journey. Starring Shia **LaBeouf and Dakota Johnson.** The Peanut Butter Falcon tells the story of Zak, a young man with Down syndrome who runs away from a residential nursing home to follow his dream of attending the professional wrestling school of his idol, The Salt Water Redneck. A strange turn of events

pairs him on the road with Tyler, a small time outlaw on the run, who becomes Zak's unlikely coach and ally. Together they wind through deltas, elude capture, drink whisky, find God, catch fish, and convince Eleanor, a kind nursing home employee charged with Zak's return, to join them on their journey. Rating: PG-13



Monos (1 hr, 42 mins)

A band of survivalist teens take a hostage and commandeer a milk cow high in the mountains. In a remote mountaintop setting somewhere in Latin America, a rebel group of teenage commandos bearing noms de guerre like Rambo, Smurf, Bigfoot, Wolf and Boom-Boom perform military training exercises while watching over a prisoner (Julianne Nicholson) and a conscripted milk cow for a shadowy force


known only as "The Organization." After an ambush drives the squadron into the jungle, fracturing their intricate bond, the mission begins to collapse. Rating: NR

Controversial attorney Roy Cohn's ruthless career, launched by his work with Senator Joseph McCarthy during the Red **Scare, is exposed in this documentary.** One of the most controversial and influential American men of the 20th Century, Roy Cohn was a ruthless and unscrupulous lawyer and political power broker whose 28-year career ranged from acting as chief counsel to Senator Joseph McCarthy's

Communist-hunting subcommittee to molding the career of a young Queens real estate developer named Donald Trump. Rating: PG-13



Judy (1 hr. 59 mins)

Renée Zellweger stars as Judy Garland as she arrives in London in 1968 to perform a series of sold-out concerts and attempt to rebuild her life. | Winter 1968 and showbiz legend Judy Garland arrives in Swinging London to perform a five-week sold-out run at The Talk of the Town. It is 30 years since she shot to global stardom in The Wizard of Oz, but if her voice has weakened, its dramatic intensity has

only grown. As she prepares for the show, battles with management, charms musicians and reminisces with friends and adoring fans, her wit and warmth shine through. Even her dreams of love seem undimmed as she embarks on a whirlwind romance with Mickey Deans, her soon-to-be fifth husband. Rating: PG-13
