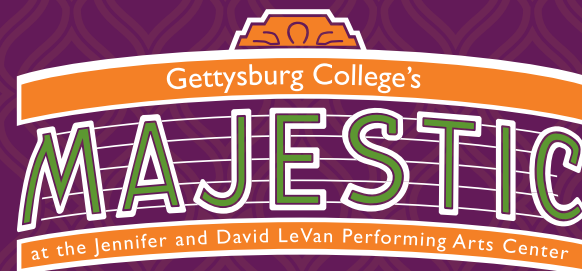

Christian McBride is an eight-time Grammy Award-winning bassist, composer, and bandleader, performing in concert with an outstanding band of musicians. McBride is the Artistic Director of the historic Newport Jazz Festival, New Jersey Performing Arts Center (NJPAC), the TD James Moody Jazz Festival, and the National Jazz Museum in Harlem. McBride hosts NPR's *Jazz Night in America* and *The Lowdown: Conversations With Christian* on SiriusXM. 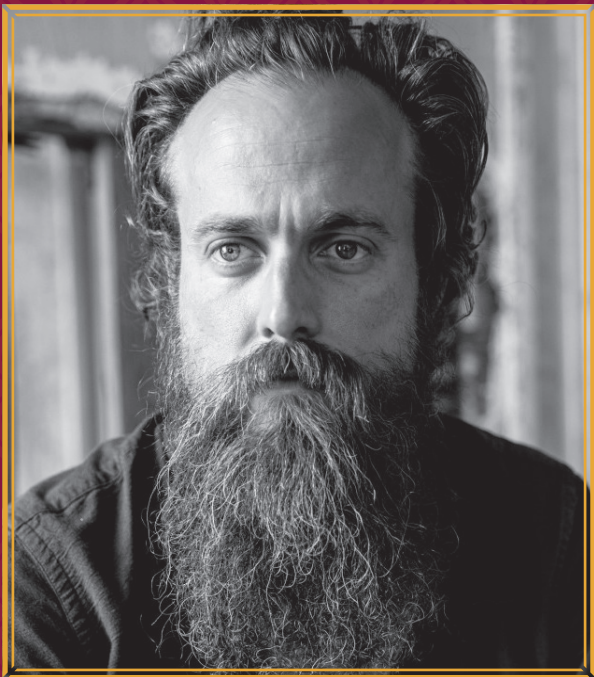


TIME FOR THREE

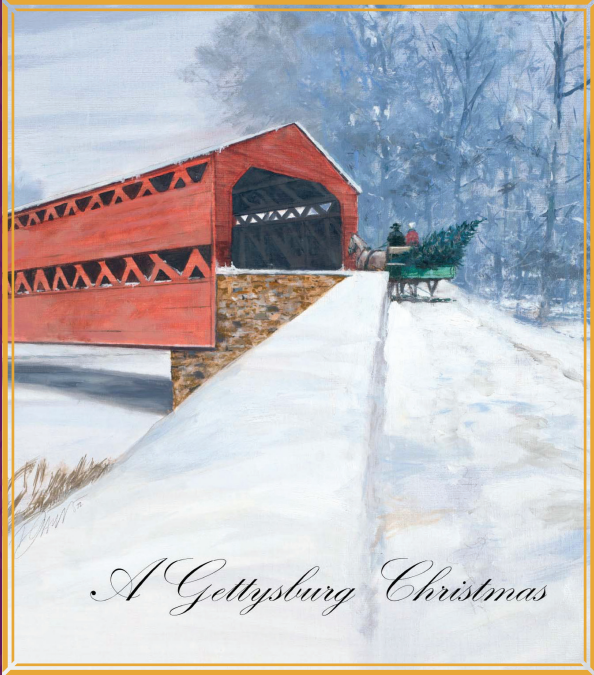
THE PROM: THE MUSICAL
